BALLROOM/LATIN AMATEUR TEACHER EXAMINATION REQUIREMENTS



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GENERAL INFORMATION

This examination is provided to Competitive Amateurs who wish to pursue teaching while still competing. Preparing for this exam will allow the candidate to attain a higher understanding of knowledge and technique which will give them a solid basis to instruct students.

If the Amateur Instructor is planning to instruct in both Standard & Latin-American, an examination must be passed in both styles.

Examination Guidelines

- Candidates must be at least 16 years of age.
- A CDTA Examiner conducts all examinations in-person at a designated examination centre.
- All Candidates will receive a written report from the Examiner.
 Successful candidates will also receive a certificate allowing them to teach.
 (Please note, this does not give them professional status.)
- During the examination, if a candidate is unsuccessful in any portion of the exam, the Examiner has the discretionary authority to end the examination, prior to fulfilling the time allotment.
- The Examiner's decision is final and no correspondence or verbal discussion may be entered into regarding the Examiner's report.
- In every category of CDTA examination, there shall be an interval of at three (3) months between a candidate being unsuccessful in an examination and retaking such examination.

Entry Procedures

- The Examination Entry Form can be found on page 11.
- Examinations are held in March, July and November. Applications and fees for Amateur Teacher exams must be received no later than thirty (30) days prior to the date of the examination. A minimum of fourteen (14) days' notice of cancellation is required. Candidates who fail to attend at the appointed time will forfeit their fees.
- Candidates must arrange to bring their own partners, either a Professional or a Student.
- Candidate must bring their own music and provide someone to play the music as required.
- The recommended attire for Candidates is:
 - 1. a suit, or sport coat and white shirt and tie.
 - 2. a dress or a skirt and blouse. (Dress or skirt length must allow for the Examiner to see the legs and feet.)
 - 3. dressy trousers and blouse

Note: tail suits, ballgowns, jumpsuits or other costume-type clothing are not suitable.

Note: To further understand examination preparation it is strongly recommended that Candidates study with a Trainer who is a qualified Teacher. The Trainer can also evaluate Candidate's knowledge, demonstrations and overall examination preparedness.

The Examination

This examination is made up of two sections:

1. PRACTICAL DEMONSTRATION

- Demonstration to music is the first requirement. The Candidate must pass this section to continue with the examination. A "classic" demonstration is expected.
- Candidate may choose to be examined as a Leader or Follower.

2. THEORY AND TECHNICAL ANALYSIS (Oral Examination)

- Questions are confined to the level of the examination becoming more challenging as Candidates progress.
- Technique and theory are based on these Reference Books:

 - Reverse Pivot Turn
 - Back Corte
 - Sidestep
 - Promenade Walk and Chasse
 - Additional figures may be used

Method of Marking

Separate grades are given in each dance in two sections: Practical Demonstration and Theory/Technical Analysis. The grade in each section is based on an average of all dances in that section. The lower score in either section determines the final grade. A Candidate who does not dance on time to the music during any portion of the demonstration may be graded as unsuccessful.

- 5. Left Side and Right Side Shoulder to Shoulder
- 6. Hand to Hand to Left Side or Right Side Position (Including Alternative Hold)
- 7. Progressive Walks Forward and Back
- 8. Side Steps to Left or Right
- 9. Cuban Rocks

- 5. Change of Places Right to Left
- 6. Change of Places Left to Right
- 7. Change of Places Behind Back
- 8. Hip Bump (Left Shoulder Shove)
- * Hand Change Method 1 & 2
- * Hand Change Method 1
- * Alternative Use of Hands
